We seek a scholar with in-depth ethnographic research linking the local and the global. The regional area of expertise is open, but applicants should complement the Department's current regional strengths or indicate how their area study would otherwise contribute to existing strengths. Demonstrated excellence in teaching large undergraduate classes, professional publications, and Ph.D. required. The Department is part of the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs. Faculty members participate in a variety of interdisciplinary Institutes and Centers. These include The Moynihan Institute of Global Affairs (with programs in Africa, East Asia, Europe, the Middle East, South Asia and Latin America and the Caribbean, including National Resource Centers in Europe and South Asia), The Alan K. Campbell Public Affairs Institute (with programs on citizenship and citizen participation), The Institute for the Study of the Judiciary, Politics and the Media, and The Institute for National Security and Counter Terrorism, the Program for the Advancement of Research on Conflict and Collaboration, the Center for Environmental Policy and Administration, and the Center for Policy Research.
